
## LAY OUT PLAYING COURT

Consider the following to determine where to install the basketball goal:

- Whether the goal is to be installed into a landscaped area next to the playing surface or into a hard-surfaced area.
- Backboard size and its extension distance from the structures.
- If court markings are to be used.
- · Amount of playing surface desired beneath the goal.
- Other functions of playing surface (such as driveway, tennis court, etc.)

The Traditional Basketball Systems will be covered by this warranty for a period of five years. Ryval Hoops shall have the right to require the purchaser to deliver the allegedly defective products to Ryval Hoops for testing, repair, or replacement. Ryval Hoops shall not be responsible for any expense associated with the replacement or removal of the product from its application for such delivery. Freight and Handling charges may apply to covered warranty parts. Modification of any product by the customer, unless approved by Ryval Hoops, will void all warranty. Where listed as "LIMITED", the warranties shall cover damage of failure that occurs during the course of NORMAL or INTENDED USE of the product. Normal or intended use shall be described as activity thet is necessary for the participation in the sport for which the equipment is damaged. NOT COVERED is damaged caused by deliberate hanging, multiple player hanging, vandalism, nonbasketball activities, or any other activity that could be regarded as abusive.

Padding Warranty: Multi-Purpose Backboard Edge Padding: one year limited; Indoor Backboard Edge Padding: five year limited (indoor only); Custom-Fit Pole Padding: one year limited; Wrap-Around Pole Padding: one year limited.

#### NOT COVERED BY THIS WARRANTY

- Use in non-residential applications of Glass backboards.
- Use in non-residential applications of Tradition complete systems.

- Paint or rusted parts.
- Deterioration of product due to time and wear.






9. Attach Goal (K) to Backboard (G). Remove the Rim box cover, put Goal against Rim pad (Pre-installed), secure it with 4 Carriage bolts M10x50 (#R1), 4 Flat washers M10 (#R2), 4 Flange nuts M10 (#R3) See Figure 6.

Tighten all four bolts and nuts.

Put Rim box cover back and secure it with removed screws.

NOTE: Use a level to make sure rim is level side to side before tightening nuts.



#### 10. Apply Rim Height Sticker

Use a tape measure to crank rim up to exactly 10' from playing surface. Make a line mark on the Actuator (B) against bottom edge of Actuator Sleeve (C).

Crank the rim all the way down to the extreme end. Peel and apply Rim Height sticker to outside of Actuator (B) lining up the mark with the 10' mark on the Rim Height Sticker.



# SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

- Before digging for the ground anchor, contact the local One-Call system in your area.
- If using a ladder during assembly, use extreme caution. Two or three people are recommended for safe installation and assembly.
- Installation and assembly of this product will require lifting and bending that may result in injury to anyone not accustom to this type of activity.
- Ensure there are no overhead power lines within a

20 ft. (7 m.) radius of the goal location.

- Climate, corrosion or misuse could result in system failure.
- The Safety Rod stops the Main Extension Arm at a rim height of 7 ft. Attempting to adjust further down will damage the arm. When the Safety Rod is removed, adjustment of the rim below a height of 6 ft. (1.83m) will cause internal damage to the mechanism.
- DO NOT HANG on the rim or any part of the goal system. This includes the backboard, support braces or net.
- During play, especially when performing dunking activities, keep the player's face away from the backboard, rim and net. Serious injury could result if teeth/face come in contact with the backboard, rim or net. Do not wear jewelry or other loose objects that could become entangled in the net.
- Twice yearly, check the goal system for loose hardware, excessive wear and signs of corrosion. Repair the system before use.
- Never play on damaged equipment.

Objects may entangle in net Keep organic material away from pole base. Grass, litter, etc. could cause corrosion and/or deterioration. Check pole system for signs of corrosion (rust, pitting, chipping) and repaint with exterior enamel paint. If rust has penetrated through the steel anywhere, replace pole immediately Check system before each vise for loose hardware, excessive wear and signs of corrosion and repair before use Never play on damaged equipment.

Attempting to adjust further down will damage the Arm With the Safety Rod removed, adjustment of the rim below height of 6'-0" (1.83m) will cause internal damage to the mechanism Installation and assembly will require lifting and bending that may result in injury to persons not accustomed to this type of activity

Contacting buried utilities may cause serious injury or death. Before you start digging, always contact your local One-Call system to help prevent personal injury, interruption of services, environmental accidents or job delays.

# **GROUND ANCHOR PLACEMENT**

NOTE: At rim height 10', distance from the face of backboard to the front of Main Post(A) is 48", Choose the proper location to dig for the concrete footing:

#### STEP A

a. Dig a hole 48" deep and 21"x 21"square . The edge of the hole should be flush with the edge of the playing surface. If you live in an area where heavy frost can occur, it may pose a problem, consult your local building inspector to determine the appropriate hole depth.

NOTE: The hole must be at least 48" deep.

b. Build a form before pouring the concrete pad, to ensure that the top of the concrete remains straight and square. The form should be placed about 1/2" above the playing surface to allow for water drainage.
c. Bell out the bottom of the hole.

NOTE: A square hole prevents the rotation of the concrete. NOTE: The area behind the playing surface must be cleared off by at least 3 feet to enable the user to stand behind the pole to adjust the Rim height.

4. Attached Actuator (B) to Lower extension Arm (F).

Slide Actuator plastic sleeve (C) over top of Actuator (B), align the hole in the Plastic sleeve with the hole in the Actuator, See **Figure 4** in previous page.

Hold the Actuator assembly, align the hole in the Plastic sleeve (C) with the Rear hole of Lower extension Arm (F), attach them together with one Hex bolt M16x305 (#2), two Flat washers M16 (#7), and one Lock nut M16 (#9).

5. Attached Actuator (B) to Actuator mounting plate (E).



Move Actuator between two Mounting plate (E), secure them together with one Hex bolt M12x120 (#5), two Flat washer M12 (#8), two Plastic washers M12 (#1), and one Lock nut (#9).

Do not over tighten this bolt.


Note: make sure Plastic washers go between Mounting plate (E) and Actuator (B). It prevents painted parts from being scratched.

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
#### **GROUND ANCHOR PLACEMENT (continued)**

#### STEP B

A. Thread a 16mm Hex Nut (U4) onto each of the 16mm J-Bolts (U2).Securely tighten the Nuts all the way down to the end of the threads.

B. Slide the threaded end of the J-Bolts through the holes in the Anchor Template (U1) and secure each J-Bolt with a 16mm J-Bolt Hex Nuts(U4) as shown. Securely tighten all Nuts at this time.

NOTE: Make sure the curved "J" ends of the J-Bolts are oriented in a rectangular pattern, as shown.



#### **GROUND ANCHOR INSTALLATION**

#### STEP C

- a. Mix the concrete according to the instructions on the bags. Note that a thicker mix of concrete will dry stronger than a thin mix. Pour the concrete into the hole, stopping approximately 18 inches from the top of the hole.
- b. Insert the four pieces of Anchor Rebar (U5) into the hole, pushing each piece firmly to the bottom of the hole. The four pieces should be arranged in a square approximately 8 inches wide so that each piece of rebar will be positioned next to the J-Bolts when the J-Bolt Template is placed in the cement.
- c. Finish filling the hole to the top with concrete. The top of the concrete should reach just above the level of the top of the form.



## **GROUND ANCHOR INSTALLATION (continued)**

#### STEP D

- a. Position the J-Bolt Template (U1) over the hole so that it is centered, with the sides of the plate square with the sides of the hole.
- b.Push the J-Bolts (U2) into the concrete until the J-Bolt Template is resting flat against the surface of the concrete.
- c. Grasp the tops of the J-Bolts and agitate the Template assembly back and forth repeatedly to eliminate any air bubbles in the concrete. Lift the Template slightly above the concrete when agitating. Make sure the Template is resting on the concrete after agitating. Form the concrete into a downward slope away from the Pole to allow water runoff.
- d. Clean off any concrete that may be on the J-Bolt Template or the exposed portions of the J-Bolts.
- e. Using a carpenter's level, make sure the Template is square to and level with the playing surface.
- f. Allow the concrete to cure for a minimum of 72 hours before installing the rest of your basketball system. In cold , wet weather or humid climates, allow additional time for the concrete to cure.

YOU ARE NOW FINISHED WITH THE INITIAL ASSEMBLY STEPS. DO NOT PRO-CEED WITH THE ASSEMBLY UNTIL THE CONCRETE HAS FULLY CURED. CUR-ING WILL TAKE A MINIMUM OF 72 HOURS. IN HUMID CLIMATES OR WET WEATHER, ALLOW ADDITIONAL TIME FOR THE CONCRETE TO CURE.

## **GOAL ASSEMBLY**

**IMPORTANT:** Concrete must cure a minimum of **72 hours** before installing goal.

**IMPORTANT:** Safe assembly of the goal requires two to three people in good physical condition and capable of lifting 80-100 lbs (36-45 kg) each.

**IMPORTANT:** Locate and familiarize yourself with all parts of the goal before beginning assembly.


